<u>Different sources of funding</u> – General Funding & Bond/Levy. There are 2 videos on our website.

- General funding \$63M funding day to day, salary
- Bond/Levy for building capital fund can only use that fund for the specific levy.
- BSF can only support the general fund.

Special Education

- We received additional \$400K for the district. We are building out our services.
- Hiring two Special Ed Directors schools will be split in half.
- Starting a parent advisory committee to get a parent's voice for the school board.

<u>Security</u>

- It is a top priority, and we understand kids are concerned.
- Regularly do drills so people know what to do.

- Sensitive to those who really struggle with these because we don't want to trigger them.
- We can never know if and when something will happen and we have trained to do the best we can in an unpredictable scenario.
